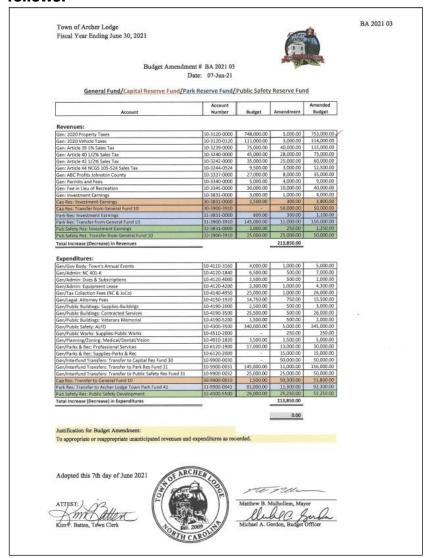

Agenda Item 6.d. – Public Hearing: Ordinances Amending the Code of Ordinances, Town of Archer Lodge, North Carolina Re:

#### Overview:

For Council's consideration is a new Unified Development Ordinance ("UDO") for the Town of Archer Lodge, NC.

The UDO is a modern, forward-looking set of development standards and rules for development application review that will be used by the Town to protect property values, preserve Archer Lodge's community character, and promote beneficial economic development.

As conveyed by Attorney Al Benshoff, The Brough Law Firm, PLLC, "... The new UDO accomplishes all of the following:

- Combines the Chapter 30 Zoning and Subdivision ordinances and the Chapter 2 Boards and Commissions article into one, new Chapter 30.
- Incorporates the changes required by the General Assembly (commonly called G.S. Chapter 160D).



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- Incorporates changes from case law.
- Incorporates the 2019 and 2020 amendments.
- Places like topics together, such as placing almost all procedures into Article 3.
- Adds several new zoning districts at Article 4.
- Adds a table for uses permitted in every zoning district (the Principal Use Table at section 30-5207).
- Updates the table of required parking (See section 30-6701).
- Adds required opens spaces (See Article 6, Div. 6 Open Space Set Aside).
- Uses tables and pictures liberally.
- Provides one procedure instead of several when possible. Eliminates redundancies
- Adds some design standards. Some design standards can be used for both subdivisions and other types of development, such as site plans.
- Updates the definitions.
- Updates the appendices.
- · Provides a new and expanded code enforcement article ...".

Future Land Use Plan (Excerpts from the 2020 Archer Lodge Comprehensive Land Use Plan):

#### Community Vision & Mission Statement:

- "Vision Statement: Today and into the future the Town of Archer Lodge, will be a
  peaceful, family oriented, active community that looks to retain our small-town,
  agricultural character meeting the needs of current and future residents and
  business."
- "Mission Statement: The Town of Archer Lodge is a community that honors and embraces its rich cultural heritage and past, pursues healthy living in the present and looks for opportunity of mold future growth into the town's core values. Archer Lodge is home to many natural resources and open-agricultural land. With an eye toward planning future growth the Town will protect these resources."

#### Future Land Use:

- The Town of Archer Lodge 2030 Comprehensive Land Use Plan (2015) identifies key
  areas for land use and growth management, it makes recommendations relating to
  community image, small economic development and skill training, business and
  farming relationships, public services and infrastructure, parks and recreation, as well
  as environmental protection and historic preservation.
- According to the plan, Archer Lodge is located within the Research Triangle Economic Development region designated by the State.
- Archer Lodge is described as a sub-rural community that combines the town's agricultural and suburban lifestyles.
- Given the influx of families moving to the town, the plan acknowledges the likelihood
  of change in the community.



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 Archer Lodge anticipates continued agricultural uses, residential developments, and business development to be the future land uses in the Town.

#### Planning Board Recommendations:

On May 19, 2021, the Planning Board reviewed/considered the UDO draft and forwards the following recommendations:

<u>Consistency Statement</u>: The Planning Board finds that the proposed amendments to the Code of Ordinances, Archer Lodge, NC, Chapter 30, Zoning and Subdivisions are reasonable and in the public interest. The proposed revisions clarify/streamline the process/procedures pertaining to development/protection of natural resources in the Town of Archer Lodge, NC in accordance with changes required by the General Assembly (commonly called Chapter 160D) and case law.

Furthermore, the proposed amendments are in accordance with the Town of Archer Lodge 2030 Comprehensive Land Use Plan, aka "Comprehensive Plan", vision mission statements and other adopted Town plans having bearing on the matter.

#### Planning Board UDO Recommendation:

The Planning Board recommends approval of the proposed text amendments including Technical Review Committee (TRC) review of Major Subdivision, to the Code of Ordinances, Archer Lodge, NC, Chapter 30, Zoning and Subdivisions.

#### Staff Recommendations:

Staff concurs with the Planning Board consistency statement findings/recommendations. Furthermore, staff recommends an annual review of the UDO be conducted in August of each year to verify compliance with changing Federal, State, Local Laws, etc. A report to be prepared/presented by staff to the Town Council/Planning Board; and updates to be subsequently drafted for Town Council/Planning Board consideration.

Staff also recommends that the UDO draft be adopted by July 1, 2021, as mandated by

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES,
TOWN OF ARCHER LODGE, NORTH CAROLINA,
CHAPTER 2 - ADMINISTRATION, ARTICLE II. BOARD AND COMMISSIONS, AND
CHAPTER 30 - ZONING AND SUBDIVISIONS

Section 1. Pursuant to authority granted by N.C. Gen. Stat. § 143 - 214.5, 160A - 174, 160D - 801, and 160D - 702, the Town of Archer Lodge hereby amends the Code of Ordinances, Town of Archer Lodge, North Carolina, as follows:

#### 7. TOWN ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

#### a) Attorney Burrell shared the following remarks:

- Reminded that the new UDO is a living document and as NC Laws change, then the other ordinances, as well as the new UDO, will need to be reviewed and possibly amended.
- Reiterated Council Member Wilson's remarks in sharing that this UDO is an excellent document that not many towns, small or large, have in place.
- Commended Attorney Benshoff and Mr. Chad Meadows for their expertise in preparing the UDO which will provide the Town a great tool, great start, and a great foundation for making changes in the future.

#### 8. TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

#### a) Mr. Gordon reported the following:

- NCDOT will begin the Curb/Gutter and Buffalo Road project during the month of June 2021 with possible road closures and asked NCDOT to provide a work schedule to assist the Town with advising the public on such.
- Plans to ensure that NCDOT provides an entrance into the Veterans Memorial Site during that project.
- Town plans to hold a Veterans Day Ceremony and Celebration on Veterans Day, Thursday, November 11, 2021, to recognize the veterans. In addition, there will be entertainment and food trucks after the ceremony.
- In the future the Town plans to include a yearly Veteran's Day Celebration and a Fall Event in the budget. Mayor Mulhollem expressed agreement in planning for the events.



- According to the Johnston County Board of Elections as of the date of this meeting, the filing period for the Municipal Election is Friday, July 2, 2021, at noon through Friday, July 16, 2021, at noon. Discussion followed regarding the possibility that it may be postponed until a later date.
- The Archer Lodge Community Center will hold the July 4th Celebration this year on Saturday, July 3, 2021, with a parade, food trucks, entertainment and fireworks.
- The Archer Lodge Community Center has tentative plans to resume their fourth Monday of the Month Meetings in July 2021.

## 9. FINANCIAL/TOWN CLERK'S REPORT:

## a) Interim Financial Reports for May 2021

Ms. Batten provided an interim summary for all funds ending May 31, 2021. She noted the fiscal year is 92% complete and the General Fund collected revenues are currently 96% of those anticipated. In addition, the expenditures in the General Fund were roughly 86% of those budgeted. In reviewing the year-to-date figures, revenues exceeded the expenditures by approximately \$135,000. Regarding the other three funds: Capital Reserve, Park Reserve and Public Safety Reserve Funds, Ms. Batten shared that the only transactions were investment earnings in each, and the three-cents transfer from the General Fund to the Park Reserve Fund.

When comparing May 2021 with May 2020, the revenues were higher, and the expenditures were lower in May 2021 with a net increase of approximately \$75,300 in May 2021.

She had no report or information to share regarding the Town Park Project. No further comments.

- Ms. Maybee informed that Ms. Barnes does a great job communicating with her regarding situations in the town.

#### b) Code Enforcement

Ms. Maybee reported the following:

- Johnston County has posted some stop-work orders due to violations.
- Working with Johnston County and State Agencies regarding the following complaints:
  - Trees being in the right-of-way
  - Burning garbage



- Chemicals stored near creek
- Oil spills on the ground
- Nuisance Vehicles
- Will be focusing more on addressing citizen complaints after having completed the adoption of the new UDO.

#### c) CAMPO

Ms. Maybee reported the following:

- April 2021 meeting was cancelled.
- May 2021 and June 2021 meetings discussed the end of year budget and mass transit.
- Traffic data provided by CAMPO being inaccurate for the area, Ms. Maybee corresponded with CAMPO Staff and shared mapping from Johnston County Geographical Information System (GIS) that showed most up-to-date views taken of the residential subdivisions up through 2017.
- The County is in the process of updating the GIS, and she will be sharing updated information with CAMPO once it becomes available.

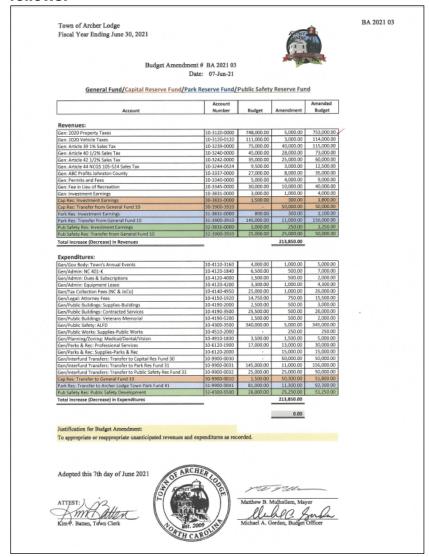

#### Overview:

For Council's consideration is a new Unified Development Ordinance ("UDO") for the Town of Archer Lodge, NC.

The UDO is a modern, forward-looking set of development standards and rules for development application review that will be used by the Town to protect property values, preserve Archer Lodge's community character, and promote beneficial economic development.

As conveyed by Attorney Al Benshoff, The Brough Law Firm, PLLC, "... The new UDO accomplishes all of the following:

- Combines the Chapter 30 Zoning and Subdivision ordinances and the Chapter 2 Boards and Commissions article into one, new Chapter 30.
- Incorporates the changes required by the General Assembly (commonly called G.S. Chapter 160D).

- Incorporates changes from case law.
- Incorporates the 2019 and 2020 amendments.
- Places like topics together, such as placing almost all procedures into Article 3.
- · Adds several new zoning districts at Article 4.
- Adds a table for uses permitted in every zoning district (the Principal Use Table at section 30-5207).
- Updates the table of required parking (See section 30-6701).
- Adds required opens spaces (See Article 6, Div. 6 Open Space Set Aside).
- Uses tables and pictures liberally.
- Provides one procedure instead of several when possible. Eliminates redundancies
- Adds some design standards. Some design standards can be used for both subdivisions and other types of development, such as site plans.
- Updates the definitions.
- Updates the appendices.
- Provides a new and expanded code enforcement article ...".

- According to the plan, Archer Lodge is located within the Research Triangle Economic Development region designated by the State.
- Archer Lodge is described as a sub-rural community that combines the town's agricultural and suburban lifestyles.
- Given the influx of families moving to the town, the plan acknowledges the likelihood
  of change in the community.

 Archer Lodge anticipates continued agricultural uses, residential developments, and business development to be the future land uses in the Town.

## a) Attorney Burrell shared the following remarks:

- Reminded that the new UDO is a living document and as NC Laws change, then the other ordinances, as well as the new UDO, will need to be reviewed and possibly amended.
- Reiterated Council Member Wilson's remarks in sharing that this UDO is an excellent document that not many towns, small or large, have in place.
- Commended Attorney Benshoff and Mr. Chad Meadows for their expertise in preparing the UDO which will provide the Town a great tool, great start, and a great foundation for making changes in the future.

#### 8. TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

### a) Mr. Gordon reported the following:

- NCDOT will begin the Curb/Gutter and Buffalo Road project during the month of June 2021 with possible road closures and asked NCDOT to provide a work schedule to assist the Town with advising the public on such.
- Plans to ensure that NCDOT provides an entrance into the Veterans Memorial Site during that project.
- Town plans to hold a Veterans Day Ceremony and Celebration on Veterans Day, Thursday, November 11, 2021, to recognize the veterans. In addition, there will be entertainment and food trucks after the ceremony.
- In the future the Town plans to include a yearly Veteran's Day Celebration and a Fall Event in the budget. Mayor Mulhollem expressed agreement in planning for the events.
- According to the Johnston County Board of Elections as of the date of this meeting, the filing period for the Municipal Election is Friday,

- July 2, 2021, at noon through Friday, July 16, 2021, at noon. Discussion followed regarding the possibility that it may be postponed until a later date.
- The Archer Lodge Community Center will hold the July 4th Celebration this year on Saturday, July 3, 2021, with a parade, food trucks, entertainment and fireworks.
- The Archer Lodge Community Center has tentative plans to resume their fourth Monday of the Month Meetings in July 2021.

## 9. FINANCIAL/TOWN CLERK'S REPORT:

## a) Interim Financial Reports for May 2021

Ms. Batten provided an interim summary for all funds ending May 31, 2021. She noted the fiscal year is 92% complete and the General Fund collected revenues are currently 96% of those anticipated. In addition, the expenditures in the General Fund were roughly 86% of those budgeted. In reviewing the year-to-date figures, revenues exceeded the expenditures by approximately \$135,000. Regarding the other three funds: Capital Reserve, Park Reserve and Public Safety Reserve Funds, Ms. Batten shared that the only transactions were investment earnings in each, and the three-cents transfer from the General Fund to the Park Reserve Fund.

When comparing May 2021 with May 2020, the revenues were higher, and the expenditures were lower in May 2021 with a net increase of approximately \$75,300 in May 2021.

She had no report or information to share regarding the Town Park Project. No further comments.

Ms. Maybee reported the following for the Planning & Zoning Report: She provided Council a copy of the Planning & Zoning Report dated July 1, 2019 - May 31, 2021.

  - Total for 2021 to Date = Approximately 3,400
- Other Activities:
  - 3 Subdivisions to Date: Bittle Creek, Vinson Park, and Harden Creek
  - o 13 Ordinance Amendments were adopted.
  - Received a Letter of Approval from the State for the Watershed Ordinance complying with State Law.

## b) Code Enforcement

Ms. Maybee reported the following:

- Johnston County has posted some stop-work orders due to violations.
- Working with Johnston County and State Agencies regarding the following complaints:
  - Trees being in the right-of-way
  - Burning garbage
  - Chemicals stored near creek
  - Oil spills on the ground
  - Nuisance Vehicles
- Will be focusing more on addressing citizen complaints after having completed the adoption of the new UDO.

## c) CAMPO

Ms. Maybee reported the following:

- April 2021 meeting was cancelled.
- May 2021 and June 2021 meetings discussed the end of year budget and mass transit.
- Traffic data provided by CAMPO being inaccurate for the area, Ms.
  Maybee corresponded with CAMPO Staff and shared mapping from

Mayor Mulhollem shared that he was sorry to hear of his loss.

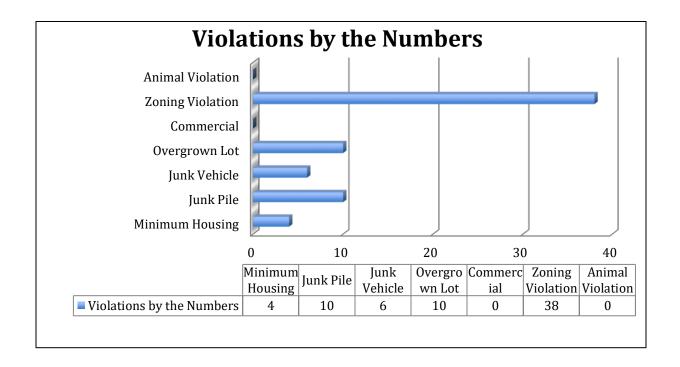
