5. <u>DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION ITEMS:</u>

a) Discussion and Consideration of the Future of the Archer Lodge Veteran's Memorial with regards to the Agreement with the Archer Lodge Veteran's Memorial Committee Three (3) Year Agreement

Points of Discussion:

- The original three-year agreement was to continue assisting with the memorial and continue with brick sales; however, the three years is over.
- Archer Lodge Veteran's Memorial Committee (ALVMC) wants to oversee the events and turned over monies in their account to the town.
- The town will apply funds to the concrete pad expenditure. (parking spaces at the memorial)
- Extra bricks will be used in the concrete pad
- ALVMC wishes for the town to handle brick sales.
- A MOU will be created to handle conditions agreed by both parties.

b) Discussion and Consideration of Adopting Budget Amendment for Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2023 \sim (BA 2023 01)

Ms. Batten explained the following reasons for amending the budget:

- Funds affected by BA 2023 01 are as follows: General Fund, Capital Reserve Fund, Public Safety Reserve Fund, ARPA Fund Grant, and the SCIF Fund Grant
- Increased revenues of the general fund Property Taxes, Animal Control fees, and Investment Earnings



- Reappropriating expenditures in funds shown.
- Increased investment earnings in all funds shown which affects the expenditures in those funds as shown.

TOWN OF ARCHER LODGE RESOLUTION SUPPORTING OPERATION GREEN LIGHT FOR VETERANS

WHEREAS, the residents of the Town of Archer Lodge have great respect, admiration, and the utmost gratitude for all of the men and women who have selflessly served our country and this community in the Armed Forces; and

WHEREAS, the contributions and sacrifices of the men and women who served in the Armed Forces have been vital in maintaining the freedoms and way of life enjoyed by our citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Archer Lodge seeks to honor these individuals who have paid the high price for freedom by placing themselves in harm's way for the good of all; and

WHEREAS, Veterans continue to serve our community in the various Veterans Services Organizations, religious groups, civil service, and by functioning as County Veteran Service Officers in 29 states to help fellow former service members access more than \$52 billion in federal health, disability and compensation benefits each year; and

WHEREAS, Approximately 200,000 service members transition to civilian communities annually; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 20 percent increase of service members will transition to civilian life in the near future; and

WHEREAS, studies indicate that 44-72 percent of service members experience high levels of stress during transition from military to civilian life; and

WHEREAS, Active Military Service Members transitioning from military service are at a high risk for suicide during their first year after military service; and

WHEREAS, Johnston County encourages all municipalities to recognize Operation Green Light for Veterans; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Archer Lodge appreciates the sacrifices of our United States Military Personnel and believes specific recognition should be granted.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Council of the Town of Archer Lodge, North Carolina, hereby declares from October through Veterans Day, November 11, 2022, a time to salute and honor the service and sacrifice of our men and women in uniform transitioning from Active Service; and

- We are adding fencing in front to keep people out
- Department Building includes 3 offices, breakroom, restroom
- We need to downsize, so we can afford it
- It mimics the town hall
- We need to tweak it and look at the cost of materials

8. FINANCE OFFICER/ASSISTANT TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

a) Interim Financial Reports for August 2022

Ms. Batten shared an interim summary for all funds ending August 31, 2022. She noted that investment earnings have increased in all funds. The actual to date net difference between revenues and expenditures in the general fund is a deficit of \$86,686.

When comparing revenues in August 2022 with August 2021 in the General Fund, the net difference is a decrease in August 2022 by approximately \$3,166; because the Ad Valorem taxes are slowly being received, and no revenues from Johnston County/ABC were distributed during this period.

Regarding the ARPA Grant Fund 41, Ms. Batten mentioned that the budget was moved around some. We haven't spent too much of it yet, but we have a list of things to purchase/labor costs.

Regarding the SCIF Grand Fund 43, Ms. Batten noted that nothing has been spent but a little bit will be coming out in September.

No further comments or discussion regarding the financials.

9. HUMAN RESOURCES OFFICER/TOWN CLERK'S REPORT:

a) Completed Projects

Ms. Martin shared the following:

- Employment law posters are now in compliance
- Plan to put an employee bulletin board in the breakroom a place where employees can see information about



- things that are going on & also a place for the council to see what is going on
- The employee file project is now completed

b) Job Postings

- Parks & Rec Director position will close this Thursday
- We have 10 applicants and 2 people that have inquired about the Parks & Rec Director position
- Plan to post the Town Administrator position next Monday
 This will give Mike time to help train the individual who will take his place
- Working with the website company to see if there is a way for candidates to apply for our positions on the website - We have a meeting with them this Wednesday

c) Personnel Policy Project

- Currently reviewing the Personnel Policy to make sure that it still lines up with our values and goals for the town
- Comparing it with Johnston County, Town of Wendell, Town of Smithfield, and Town of Selma's personnel policies

d) State Health Plan Open Enrollment 2023

- Open enrollment is this month for employees
- Will work on getting the employees all of the information that they need and help them enroll

10. MAYOR'S REPORT:

- a) Mayor Mulhollem shared the following:
 - Boy Scout Troop will have a Flag Retirement Ceremony here at the Veterans Memorial on Saturday, October 15th at 9:30 a.m.
 - Last month, Mayor mentioned an eagle scout project town park property, the 5-acre piece, - a line of crepe myrtles with potentially azaleas or some other type of scrub in between - information has been given to the scout

11. COUNCIL MEMBERS' REMARKS:



(non-agenda items)

a) Council Member Bruton discussed minutes for previous meetings. She mentioned that there is nothing in the general statute with regards to the format of minutes. She inquired with legal counsel if recordings could be adopted.

Points of Discussion:

- The public would have to have access to the recordings
- The public would have to know who is speaking in the recordings, so probably not good to adopt recordings
- b) Council Member Wilson is looking forward to Veteran's Day and will have a writing of some type to read aloud. He also mentioned advertising the bricks as gifts to honor veterans.
- c) Council Member Jackson mentioned about the green light, and he has noticed that when they come back from deployments or get out of the military, it's important for their mental health to get into veteran organizations. He pointed out that when we sold biscuits, that was helpful to our veterans. Council Member Jackson brought up that some meet every third Friday at Jones Café and have biscuits there at 8:00a.m. He encouraged that if you see anybody who has come out of the military, encourage then to join some kind of veterans' organization.
- d) Mayor Pro Tem Castleberry mentioned that Veteran's Day is coming up. He expressed that the park has been a big part of his heart, but the Veteran's Memorial has meant a lot more to him. Mayor Pro Tem Castleberry informed that people talk about the Veteran's Memorial; the word is getting out. He said that during the biscuit sales, he made very special friends.
- e) Council Member Purvis had no additional remarks.

Proclamation



WHEREAS, lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer death among men and women in the United States and North Carolina, accounting for more deaths than colon cancer, breast cancer, pancreatic cancer, and prostate cancer combined; and

WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control, there were 41,258 new lung cancer cases and 27,124 deaths because of lung cancer between 2014 and 2018 in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the 5-year survival rate for localized lung cancer is 59%, yet only 17% of lung cancers are diagnosed at this stage; and

WHEREAS, screening for lung cancer for high-risk individuals using low-dose computed tomography can lead to the earlier detection of lung cancer and save lives, reducing mortality by 20% when compared to screening by chest x-ray in the National Lung Screening Trial and reducing the risk of death at 10 years by 24% in men and 33% in women as demonstrated by another large, randomized trial; and

WHEREAS, funding for lung cancer research trails far behind funding for research of many other cancers, and additional research is needed in early diagnosis, screening, and treatment for lung cancer; and

WHEREAS, lung cancer in never smokers is the 7th leading cause of cancer-related death and accounts for 17,000-26,000 deaths in the US every year, and the proportion of lung cancers diagnosed in never smokers is increasing in the US; and

WHEREAS, organizations working in North Carolina, such as the American Lung Cancer Screening Initiative and Women's Lung Cancer Forum, are committed to educating about lung cancer and lung cancer screening and working to increase lung cancer screening rates in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, this November, we recognize the need for research to help find the cure of lung cancer, the need for screening, the survivors, those battling the disease, and those who have lost their lives; and

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE PROCLAIMED by the Honorable Mayor and the Town Council of the Town of Archer Lodge, North Carolina, do hereby proclaim November 2022 as

Lung Cancer Awareness Month

I also encourage citizens to wear white ribbons in honor of those who have lost their lives to lung cancer and those who are now bravely fighting this disease.
